Create a business culture of compliance

Artifacts "Stuff"

- LCB posters on the sales floor
- L&I posters in the breakroom
- Packaging that complies with LCB and WSDA laws
- Compliant floor plan and parking plan filed with the city
- Clear and up-to-date sales records
- Training materials that ensure all staff members learn about compliance

Behavior Actions we can see

- □ Sales staff checks IDs
- Staff members ask questions to verify that they are operating correctly
- Timely CCRS filings
- Regular meetings with an accountant to go over tax payments
- Conversations and meetings about the compliant way to do things
- Reading industry news about changes to cannabis laws
- Learning about compliance (in other words, what you are doing right now!)



Underlying values Attitudes/assumptions

- □ Value placed on compliance
- Beliefs about the risk of noncompliance
- Habits around paying fees and taxes
- Assumptions about what you can "get away with"
