	Make a plan to stay informed about changes to the law.

	Get an Employer Identification Number, or EIN, for your business. https://ein-taxfiling.com/	
	A fiscal year is a 12-month accounting period that a business uses for financial and tax reporting purposes. Work with your accountant to learn about the advantages and disadvantages of a fiscal year that is not the same as the calendar year. Then decide on your fiscal year.	
	Make a plan with your accountant to make estimated tax payments.	
	File a tax return at the end of your fiscal year.
