Washington State Department of Agriculture (WSDA)	 □ WSDA regulates cultivation and testing of cannabis plants in Washington State. You must ensure that products you sell are sourced from licensed producers and processors that comply with WSDA regulations. Record-keeping and documentation are important for compliance. https://agr.wa.gov/departments/cannabis □ WSDA makes sure that scales and package labeling meet strict accuracy standards. The WSDA Weights and Measures Program conducts unannounced inspections to verify that scales meet accuracy and technical standards.
